# India Engagement

The University of Melbourne is widely recognised as Australia's leading university. We aim for global excellence, relevance and impact in our teaching and research, informed by an international outlook and marked by global collaboration. The University is increasing its engagement with India through a wide range of joint programs, including those highlighted below. We are also home to the Australia India Institute, and have an established presence in Mumbai.

## Rural Health Project

For the past decade, the University's Nossal Institute for Global Health has collaborated on primary health care projects with the Jamkhed Institute in Maharashtra, resulting in remarkable medical and socio-economic achievements, as well as giving Melbourne students an invaluable intercultural learning experience.

## Architecture Travelling Studio

Working closely with Indian counterparts, academics from the Melbourne School of Design have organised several Travelling Studio programs in India.

In 2011, sixteen graduate students and academics visited Mumbai to work with The Society for the Promotion of Area Resource Centres investigating informal settlements in Dharavi. Staff and students will be travelling to Madvi for a new international studio in 2012.

## International Security Studies in Delhi

Melbourne's Graduate School of Humanities and Social Sciences has established an exciting collaboratively-taught subject on international security with the University of Delhi and the University of Birmingham. After a successful introduction in 2011 with students from all three universities participating, the subject will again be co-taught at the University of Delhi in 2012.
